Q7 In 2014, twice as many District residents died from a drug overdose than from a traffic accident. More than half of those overdose cases involved heroin or prescription painkillers. A drug called naloxone is successful at reversing overdose from heroin and prescription painkillers. Naloxone acts fast and has no potential for abuse. Local DC law already allows anyone to carry naloxone to help save their friends and loved ones, but naloxone supplies in DC are low.
